Explanation

The increase of the electricity tariffs is the result of a decrease in the average fuel expenses for the production of electricity due to a decrease in the fuel prices in combination with the expected production-mix (including a slightly higher share of energy from wind turbines and an increased operation of more cost-efficient production-units) and a higher correction factor for the month of April 2023. The decrease of the water tariffs is the result of a decrease of the electricity expenses for the production of water in combination with a significantly lower correction factor for the month of April 2023.
