Explanation

There is an increase in the average fuel costs for electricity production combined with a decrease in the correction factor regarding May 2025, resulting in an increase in the electricity tariffs. The increase in the water tariffs is the result of higher electricity costs for the production of water and a higher correction factor regarding May 2025.
